On September 16, President Obama launched "[Change the Equation](#)" a [partnership with HP](#) and other members of the business community to seek new ways to keep American students competitive in a technology centered future. In a statement, President Obama applauded "HP and its partners for lending their resources, expertise, and their enthusiasm to the task of strengthening America's leadership in the 21st century by improving education in science, technology, engineering and math."

[The HP Catalyst Initiative](#) is aimed at addressing science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) education, developing innovative solutions that will transform the future of STEM education in the US and across the world. HP is investing more than \$5.5 million in grants to 35 education institutions across 11 countries.



## HP Named Top Corporate Citizen in Government Contracting

*Corporate Responsibility* magazine has named [HP the 2010 best corporate citizen in government contracting](#). The 11th annual assessment takes into account more than 300 publicly-available data points among a broad spectrum of issues, and HP ranked among the top three in the domains of environmental performance, corporate governance and philanthropy. HP also ranked in the top 20 in climate change, human rights and employee relations — a strong performance considering the assessment included the largest companies listed in the [Russell 1000 index](#).

## IT, Environmental Action and the Military

For decades, HP has built and expanded a strong relationship with our nation's armed forces and related agencies. ## HP Donation Helps Vermont Elementary School Overcome Theft

In September, HP and Microsoft came to the aid of Dummerston Elementary School in Vermont after learning of a June break-in that resulted in the theft of 28 computers. HP replaced the stolen computers with 30 new HP laptops, five desktops and other equipment with a combined value of more than \$30,000.
