Farrand joined HP by way of acquisition of RLX Technologies in October 2005. He joined the founding team at RLX Technologies in December 2000 and was responsible for operating systems support, ServerBlade management and solutions development for scale-out applications.

He formerly worked for Alta Vista Company, where helped port the infrastructure for the search engine web software from C/C++ on an expensive compute infrastructure to many inexpensive Linux industry-standard x86 servers.

Prior to Alta Vista, Farrand was at Compaq Computer Corporation for 12 years, where he founded and developed Compaq's first systems management products. He brought these products through several generational designs, including web-based solutions and porting multiple platforms that included: Windows NT®, NetWare, SCO-Unix, Tru64 Unix, Win95, Win98 and OS/2.

Before joining Compaq, Farrand founded a start-up software company, where he developed the Windows Terminal program.

Farrand earned a Bachelor of Science in mechanical engineering from the University of Illinois. He holds 10 U.S. patents in systems management.
