Compatible solutions from Microsoft and HP are tested by more than 11,000 Microsoft-certified professionals. With more than 22,000 HP professionals trained on Microsoft technologies, customers can deploy virtualization technologies from the desktop to the data center quickly, easily and with a high degree of confidence. 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- provide the complete infrastructure of operating system and management software, servers and storage to deploy a virtualized solution.
- Preparing the channel for <u>cloud computing</u> HP and Microsoft are providing resellers with the tools and solutions needed for the growing cloud services marketplace. Resellers can generate new revenue streams by offering their small and midsize business (SMB) customers a greater choice of solution delivery methods that take advantage "private label" Microsoft solutions that are hosted by managed service providers. This will make it easier to plan for and deploy hosted web services and allow resellers to extend their role as strategic IT advisors as their customers migrate to web services.
- Delivering end-to-end <u>unified communications and collaboration</u> As part of the Frontline Partnership, the two companies launched in May 2009 a global initiative and expect to invest up to an additional \$180 million over four years in product development, professional services and joint sales and marketing to help organizations lower cost and improve productivity. An end-to-end unified communications and collaboration solution, which is planned to span software, hardware, networking and services, would enable customers to improve business output and reduce travel, telecom and IT operating costs.
- Unleashing new business value and <u>enhanced enterprise-wide security</u> Microsoft and HP brought together the people, processes and technologies needed to help enhance protect highly sensitive business information, privacy and business continuity. The collaboration provides a broad range of flexible solutions to help protect business-critical applications that address IT security requirements and improve enterprise-wide security.
