

How to Locate and Claim Unclaimed Property

From time to time, retirees have contacted HP regarding long-forgotten accounts or other unclaimed property that was never claimed. Like any company, HP is subject to the authority of individual states, all of which have laws that govern the reporting and claiming of unclaimed property.

Unclaimed property can include stock, bonds, mutual funds, bank accounts, uncashed payroll checks, utility deposits and other property that you own, but the state is holding on your behalf. The following guidelines are intended to help retirees search for and claim unclaimed property, whether related to HP or concerning any other property that you own. Good luck with your search:

- The property is filed with the state of your last known address.
- If you provided a non-U.S. address, the property would be filed in the state of incorporation of the company. In the case of HP, for example, the unclaimed property filing would be in Delaware. Please note that HP previously was incorporated in California.
- If you have lived in multiple states, you would search unclaimed property records for each state.
