"I'm more comfortable and efficient using the tablet PC to work in my EMR. A lot of things that used to be done at the end of the day, I can do now in real time, when I'm with a patient. So I'm not sitting in my office as late at night."

His office uses e-MDs Solution Series software, an integrated Electronic Medical Record and Practice Management package designed to improve care, reduce errors and simplify the business side of a small practice.

Templates in the EMR allow him to enter data from patient interviews, present treatment plans, update patient charts, and electronically order lab tests and imaging studies. His staff uses the same integrated package to handle billing and document management.

When patients come to Dr. Miller's office, the staff updates their personal information and enters vital signs into the system. By the time Dr. Miller enters the room, he has accessed the patient's EMR on the tablet PC, reviewed medications and the patient's surgical needs. He has a template for many of the standard procedures he performs hernia operations, colonoscopies, and more.

"Traditionally, as patients are talking with the surgeon, the doctor is scribbling away and loses eye contact," he says. "With my tablet PC, I'm checking off some boxes and writing a few words here and there using my stylus. I'm able to be a lot more responsive to the patient."

In most cases, he has the tablet PC in tablet mode that is, he uses the stylus to click on software choices and enter handwritten notes. "It's a lot closer to what most doctors are used to," he says.

"Before, I was writing everything on a piece of paper and I would come back when I had spare time to enter the same information on a keyboard. Now, my notes are done. I don't need to come back to re-enter anything. Generally speaking, I'm done when the patient leaves the room."

He will sometimes show a patient an image from a procedure, and later save it into the patient's record. "It shows that I explained to them what I would be doing, and it's time-stamped which is good from a medical-legal perspective."

Pre-admission orders and imaging studies are also entered through the templates. Dr. Miller can also elect the appropriate set of patient instructions and send them to a printer in the outer office. By the time the patient walks to the front counter, all the paperwork is there and waiting.

CONVENIENT FOR IN-HOSPITAL USE

When Dr. Miller goes to Grenada Lake Medical Center he continues to use his HP Tablet PC. There, the tablet becomes his mobile terminal to access the hospital's Siemens MedSeries4 Clinical Suite software as well as the GE PACS system that stores imaging studies.

He retrieves documents electronically from the hospital systems, eliminating the need to generate paper copies just for his use. "In the past, if I needed particular patient records, the hospital would fax them over to my office," Dr. Miller notes. "Now I can just pull them up on my tablet PC as a PDF."

The HP EliteBook is Dr. Miller's third tablet PC. He still has both of the others, but uses the new EliteBook tablet PC most. "It's smaller, lighter and more portable," he notes. "So it's convenient to take with me wherever I go. And it still has a very good keyboard—the best of the tablets I've used."

Dr. Miller says his office staff notices immediately if for some reason he's working without his tablet PC. "The fact is, I can't do my job as well or as fast without my tablet PC. We get backed up."
